I started off my Thanksgiving holiday this year by sitting in a room full of clergy and church members at a church security and active shooter training seminar. I have to be honest, even typing those words makes my heart heavy. Never in my life did I ever dream I would have to attend such a meeting. And yet, the threat is very real. Between 2006 and 2016, there were 147 church shootings. If you open that to include all houses of worship (including syna-

gogues and mosques), the number increases to more than 250. Many of you, like me, watched in horror as the story of the mass shooting in Texas unfolded. Twenty-six people in all – including the Pastor's own daughter – were among the dead.

This article is not about church security, however, other than to say that the leadership of both St. Luke's and ELCC are discussing the issue. No, this article is about darkness.

In Advent, we observe days growing shorter. We are literally enveloped by darkness. When we look around our world, there are times when we feel as if the darkness is surrounding us, and that if something is not done (and soon), the darkness will overtake us. Sometimes it is hard to have to hope, and we feel as if the brokenness of the world will be too much to bear.

The traditional Gospel reading for Christmas Day Divine Service is from John 1, with the fifth verse reminding us that, "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it." That light was and is Jesus Christ. In the midst of darkness, Jesus reveals to us that God loves this world. God also calls us to both dwell in the light of Christ and to share that light with others.

The best thing a Christian can do in the face of seemingly overwhelming darkness is to embrace the light of Christ and to share that light with others. When we say that Christ is light in the darkness, we do not mean to offer an empty platitude. We do not intend it to be a slogan or a bumper sticker zinger. It is mean to be life-changing! It is meant to change our priorities and to turn the current order of the world upside down.

This year at Advent and Christmas, the best gift you can give someone is not something you wrap. It is not something that you can put under a tree. The best gift you can give is the gift of light. Share the

story of Jesus with someone who has never heard. Better yet, demonstrate the story of Jesus to someone by being light for them. Show the world that we have faith that Light has come into the world, and that the darkness cannot overcome it, no matter how bad or scary or dark the world may seem.


Silent Auction 2017


